Changing The Story Of Disability

Our Vision

An inclusive world where all children with disabilities can participate and thrive.

A Different Question

For too long, children with disabilities were defined by **what was wrong** with them. The predominant deficit-focused model defined children by what they couldn't do instead of looking for their strengths.

Sethu asks a different question: "**What's possible?**" Our work is grounded in the **World Health Organization's International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) framework** with its focus on the **biopsychosocial model**. The ICF way of understanding disability looks at the child as a whole, not just the diagnosis to be treated. Over two decades of working alongside children with disabilities and their families, we've seen what that shift makes possible.

STRENGTHS-BASED

Every child has strengths, interests, and ways of engaging with the world that are uniquely their own. We help children identify their strengths, communicate challenges, make choices, and take part in decisions that affect them.

NEURO-AFFIRMING

Sethu's work is about celebrating neurodiversity and recognising that there are many valid ways of thinking, learning, and experiencing the world. All brains are different, not less.

FAMILY-CENTRED

In 1995, our first child had a medical condition and we sought a second opinion. A young Dr Nandita, examined him, smiled, and said that he did not need the heavy layers he had been covered with during the Goan summer. She spared him unnecessary procedures. Milestones Along the Way

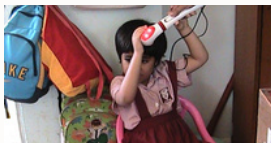

We were awarded the Navhind Times–Viva Goa Achievement NGO Award for Social Empowerment in 2010, based on public votes and a final selection by a panel of leaders in industry.

We were awarded a grant of Rs 25 lakhs under the Blessed Mother Teresa Scheme in the Golden Jubilee Year of Goa's Liberation.

2014-15

We trained 26 Anganwadi teachers of the Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS) in child development and disability, in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Panaji.

Sethu became the first centre in India to offer PEERS (Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relational Skills), an evidence-based social skills programme for adolescents, developed at UCLA.

2019-20

We won the State Award for Best NGO in Disability.

2020-21

The pandemic pushed us to offer online services to 755 children during the lockdown.

Sethu became Asia's first organisation to offer Social ABCs, a communication programme for toddlers developed at the Holland Bloorview Centre in Canada, through the Indo-Canadian Autism Network.

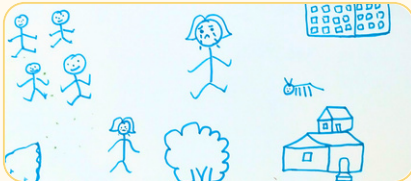

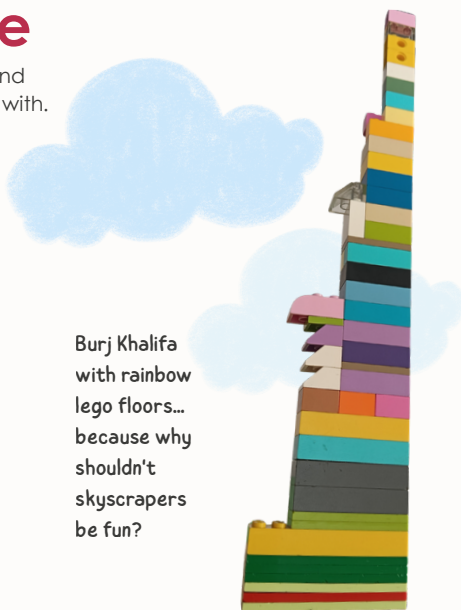

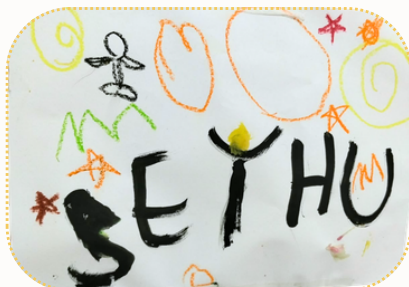

Bridging Gaps

This year, Sethu continued to build an ecosystem of care around the child, training families in our **neuro-affirming, strengths-based, family-centred approach**. We started new conversations about invisible disabilities; partnering with corporates, management institutes, and schools across Goa to build better understanding and support.

10 years of Gnyandeep

For the past decade, Gnyandeep has supported Anganwadi teachers to create spaces where all children, including children with disabilities, can learn and participate together. In partnership with **Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS)** and with the sustained support of the **Cipla Foundation**, the programme has trained teachers in early identification, child development, disability, and inclusion; strengthening their skills to make their Anganwadis more inclusive and to support all children and families.

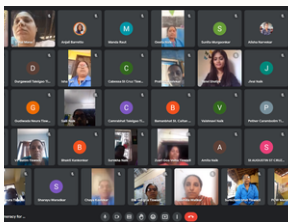

Purple Purpose

In October 2025, Sethu participated in Purple Fest at Entertainment Society of Goa, Panaji, sharing our approach to inclusion across three spaces — families through Purple Parivaar, schools through Purple Power, and workplaces through Purple Pragati.

Purple Parivaar

At Purple Fest, Sethu came together with COOJ Mental Health Foundation, Owl House, and Buddy Up to create Purple Parivaar, a shared space of interactive activities and mini-workshops that covered everything from parenting stress and workplace accommodations to long-term financial planning for a child's future.

With the Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Nishtha Vigyan Pvt. Ltd., and Beyond Labels™, Sethu brought together corporates including EPL, IHCL, Marriott St. Regis, Google, Microsoft, and Disha AI, alongside government leaders and families, to shift workplace inclusion from a checkbox to a practice, featuring real accounts from persons with disabilities employed at IHCL and St. Regis. Sethu went on to train 54 managers at IHCL Taj Cidade Goa on neurodiversity in the workplace.

Together, We All Belong

In April 2026, Sethu partnered with the **Office of the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities** and other stakeholders to host Together, We All Belong, a community event **celebrating individuals with Down syndrome and Autism**. Through performances, community activities, stalls, and shared experiences, the event highlighted the strengths, talents, and aspirations of neurodivergent individuals.

Autism Fun Day



Autistic children, siblings, and their parents came together for an afternoon of swimming, art and sensory activities, with plenty of opportunities to **play, connect, and enjoy time together**. Families appreciated the opportunity to connect with one another.

Move, Shine, and Mingle



As part of **ADHD Awareness Month**, Sethu brought children and families together for a fun afternoon where children showcased their talent and parents explored simple ways to support their own well-being.

Carnival of Champions



For **World Disability Day**, children with disabilities and their families came together for carnival games, creative activities, music, dancing, and a champions' parade; creating opportunities to participate, try new things, and explore their interests.

Taking Sethu's Approach Beyond Goa

Dr Nandita de Souza presented at the **International Developmental Paediatrics Association Congress in Guatemala**, sharing Sethu's clinical patterns in ADHD care and introducing "This Is Me", a tool designed to help neurodivergent children develop self-awareness. At the **Global Autism Convention in Bengaluru**, she presented on early neuro-affirmative autism diagnosis, chaired a session on gender dysphoria, and moderated a round-table discussion on academic challenges and classroom solutions.

In February 2026, Andre Velho (Head, Autism Programme), Aileen de Souza (Head, Mental Health Programme), Vivien Vas (Autism Interventionist), and Dr. Rucha Mehta (Paediatrician) travelled to Hyderabad for a meeting of the **Indo-Canadian Autism Network (I-CAN)**, presenting a complex case as part of the network's ongoing knowledge-sharing between Canadian and Indian autism experts.

Dr. Rucha Mehta's study, conducted during her **Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) Fellowship**, was presented at the **22nd National Conference of Developmental Paediatrics** and the **2nd SANBEPA Congress** in Trivandrum, and has been published in *BMJ Open Paediatrics*.
